

Disclosures of nurses on dengue

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Dear Scientific Editor of REBEn,

The recent publication "Accountability of the other: discourses of nurses of the Family Health Strategy on the occurrence of dengue" is very interesting⁽¹⁾. Reis et al. concluded that "discourse of nurses is very close to common sense, generalizing inadequate behaviors⁽¹⁾". Indeed, it is proved that "nurses conceptions on comprehensiveness are directly relates with providing care⁽²⁾". Hence understanding the behavior relating to an occurrence of a disease is important. It can trace the way of the inter-relationship between nurses and patients as well as other medical personnel⁽³⁾ interest, the common sense seems to be important part determining the disclosure behavior. This reflects the concerns on humanistic rather than scientific evidence.

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
